Our Whisky menu has Whisky distilleries arranged traditionally, by region to make it easiest to find your favourite distilleries.

We hope this makes it easier however, if its all still a bit daunting don't hesitate to ask one of our staff or simply wander to the bar for a look over the selection.

Islay

Long associated with smoky whiskies, it's well known now that Islay is by no means a one trick pony. Islay produces whiskies all along the smoke spectrum, from the heavily medicinal distilleries on the southern Kildalton Coast, to the completely smoke free numbers from Bunnahabhain and Bruichladdich.

Our pick of the Islay distilleries is Bunnahabhain, not simply because of their versatility making both unpeated and smoky drams, but because of the sheer variety of casks they so creatively use.

Highland

As the highland scene diversifies more and more, we've chosen to highlight a new distillery here. Ardnamurchan comes from the peninsula of the same name; the most westerly point of the UK mainland. Ardnamurchan's house style - as reflected in the AD release - is born of some clever in house blending. The distillery makes peated and unpeated spirit and ages in a variety of casks.

Speyside

Speyside is home to more distilleries than anywhere else in Scotland, including Scotland's biggest distilleries, some of its best known and some of its best liked. Glen Moray is a classic Speysider - fruity, with plenty of vanilla-like sweetness and a nice touch of Glen Moray's spirit is nuanced and gentle yet robust, standing up well to almost any type of cask. We're fortunate enough to stock Glen Moray in a huge range of casks, including sheries, wines and port.

Campbeltown

Once the Whisky Capital of Scotland, it is home now to just three distilleries - though fortunately one of two more are in the works. Glen Scotia, despite being one of the country's smallest distilleries, has taken home a host of gongs recently; including Best Distillery and World's Best Whisky during last year's awards season. We've chosen to highlight them because we love them, and not just because it's so difficult to get anything from their neighbours...

Lowlands

A region that is seeing a huge resurgence, the Lowlands' new distilleries are talking the traditional Lowland style - light, fruit-forward drams - and using modern production and maturation techniques to hone their whiskies into some of the most clear cut and fresh drams around. We've chosen to highlight Kingsbarns, who are near St Andrews. The distillery was originally the vision of a local caddie, hence the name of their expression.

Islands

While The Islands aren't technically a region - falling instead mainly into the Highlands - it is an easy way to section off these slightly different whiskies. We've chosen to shine a light on Arran distillery - producing peated and unpeated spirit and filling many different cask types, they provide a huge range of whisky that still stays true to their distillery style.

Blends and the Rest of the World

With the much-welcomed decline in Single Malt Scotch snobbery, other categories are getting their time in the sun. We're thrilled to be able to stock a great range of blended Whisky as well as Whiskies from nearly every corner of the globe. It turns out that anyone with grain, water and a copper kettle can make the stuff - yes, even England.

Next to every Whisky is a two part (a letter and a number) code. These correspond to some general flavour profiles (FP)

1. Light cask influence (Bourbon or light wine)
 2. Medium cask influence, perhaps a finish in red wine or sherry
 3. Heavy cask influence, likely full maturation in sherry or red wine

 - C. Heavily Peated

The George Whisky Flight - (6 x 15ml: £27)

If you are new to whisky, this flight gives an opportunity to discover the styles of whisky that best suit you. With almost 150 single malt distilleries in Scotland it can be daunting to know where to start. By the end of these drams you will know which styles you like (or don't, that's fine too) making our immense selection seem far more approachable. These are arranged in the best theoretical order in which to drink them (as the smokier stuff at the end will linger on the taste buds a bit), but drink them however you so choose.

1. Glen Moray 12 Year Old - Speyside (Elgin) - £3.95

Speyside is home to more distilleries than anywhere else in Scotland, including Scotland's biggest distilleries, some of its best known and some of its best liked. Glen Moray is a classic Speysider - fruity, with plenty of vanilla-like sweetness and a nice touch of oak influence. Glen Moray's spirit is nuanced and gentle yet robust, standing up well to almost any type of cask. The 12 is a great jumping off point; if this is to your liking, we stock Glen Moray in a huge range of ages and casks - including sheries, wines and port.

2. Lochlea 'Our Barley' - Lowland (Ayrshire) - £6.75

One of Scotland's newest wave of distilleries (situated in the country's south west), Lochlea was once the home of National Treasure Robbie Burns. This release is named for the Lochlea's connection to the land and the local barley they use. Honouring the classic lowland style of fruity, floral whisky, Lochlea have made an impact with this dram being complex yet imminently drinkable. A bourbon, sherry and red wine casks lend just enough complexity and depth to round out its lighter style.

3. Glen Scotia Double Cask - Campbeltown - £5.75

Campbeltown has had a tumultuous distilling past. Once the Whisky Capital of Scotland, it is home now to just three distilleries - though fortunately one or two more are in the works. Glen Scotia, despite being one of the country's smallest distilleries, has taken home a host of gongs recently; including Best Distillery and World's Best Whisky during last year's awards season. The Double Cask has everything you want from a Campbeltown whisky - some sweetness, some coastal salinity and just a little bit of that Campbeltown Funk whisky nerds love so much.

4. Arran 10 Year Old - Islands £6.75

While The Islands aren't technically a region - falling instead mainly into the Highlands - it is an easy way to section off these slightly different whiskies. Arran's spirit is known for being tropical at its heart, with lots of bright summer fruits shining through. The 10 Year Old adds to this a sherry cask influence, bringing some richness and sweet spices that perfectly compliment Arran's style. Arran have also long been known for their cask finishes, so if this hits the spot there are a few to move onto as well.

5. Ardnamurchan 'AD' - Highlands (West) £7.15

Another one new to the scene, Ardnamurchan comes from the peninsula of the same name; the most westerly point of the UK mainland. Ardnamurchan's house style - as reflected in this expression - is born of some clever in house blending. The distillery makes peated and unpeated spirits, which are mixed here in equal parts. On top of this, 65% of the spirit spends its maturation in ex-bourbon casks, the balance in ex-sherry casks. The result is a lightly peated single malt, with some robust highland characteristics and a honey sweetness.

6. Bunnahabhain 'Toiteach a Dha' (Pron. Toy-check a Da) - Islay (North) £5.85

Bunnahabhain, situated on the north coast of Islay, is one of the island's most scenic distilleries, looking straight over the water to the Paps of Jura - in fact, in the early days the distillery was only accessible by boat. Bunnahabhain produce both peated and unpeated spirit, and both are of great quality. The Toiteach (lit. 'Second Smoke') is a medium-heavily peated dram with an oily characteristic and lots of classic Islay smoke.

Tour of Scotland Whisky Flight (6 x 15ml: £30)

1. Isle of Skye 12yo - £4.40

The peat smoke is there but so are some other more fruity bright flavours. This is smooth and balanced, a great sipping whisky and a one for the adventurous cocktail makers. There are a range of flavours to work off with this one, it's a bartender's dream.

2. Glengoyne 12yo - £5.60

The Glengoyne 12-Year-Old is an unpeated Highland Single Malt Scotch Whisky, a testament to a production process so slow it's known as Scotland's slowest distillation. Matured for 12 years in hand-selected sherry casks, it has a well-balanced character where fruit and sweetness take center stage without a hint of smoke. At 43% ABV, it is a complex yet approachable dram, certified vegan and sustainably produced.

3. Glengoyne White Oak - £6.60

A first for Glengoyne, this brand new expression is matured exclusively in First Fill Bourbon and Virgin Oak Casks sourced from North America. These casks are charred for less than a minute allowing the Glengoyne spirit to shine, unladen. White Oak sings of vibrant wood and bright citrus, unripe banana and a hint of violets. The palate is soft and playful with touches of creme brulee, fruit gums and pineapple. At 48% the finish is long and smooth, giving flavours of toffee apple.

4. Tamdhu 12yo - £8.15

Tamdhu 12 Year Old is a rich and silky Speyside single malt, matured exclusively in Oloroso sherry oak casks from Jerez, Spain. With natural colour, no chill-filtration, and a flavour profile bursting with dried fruit, spice, and a whisper of smoke, this award-winning whisky is a true expression of Tamdhu's dedication to sherry cask perfection.

5. Smokehead Original - £4.90

With immense smoke and notes of sea salt and spice, this is a vigorous whisky that stands out from the crowd. Smokehead is an intensely peated Islay single malt for those who reject the ordinary. Designed for bold palates, it delivers a powerful and unconventional whisky experience that defies tradition.

6. Smokehead Tequila Cask - £6.10

Push boundaries and defy convention with the bold and electrifying Smokehead Tequila Cask Terminado Whisky, a rebellious single malt finished in Tequila casks. This unorthodox union combines the raw intensity of Islay's peat smoke with the zesty, vibrant character of tequila, resulting in a whisky that's as daring as it is delicious. Bottled at a robust 43% ABV, Smokehead Terminado takes the brand's edgy persona to new heights. The tequila cask finish adds a surprising twist to the signature Smokehead flavour profile, creating a unique fusion of smoky, earthy, and citrusy notes that dare you to rethink whisky tradition.

Old and Rare Whisky Flight (6 x 15ml: £195)

1. Isle of Skye 30yo - £40.00

This 30 Year Old blended Scotch whisky is a wonderful example of old whiskies put in casks 3 decades previous. This blend contains rare gems from the islands, and the mainland, lovingly handcrafted into an elegant time travelling masterpiece. Creamy, vanilla with luscious buttery pastry notes, melts together with demerara sugar and soft spices. This incredibly rare whisky is certainly worth the wait.

2. Tamdhu 15yo - £10.30

Tamdhu 15 Year Old is a limited release Speyside single malt, matured exclusively in the finest American and European Oloroso sherry oak casks. Bottled at 46% ABV, with natural colour and no chill-filtration, it delivers an intense burst of summer fruits, rich spice, and a rewardingly long finish, a true showcase of Tamdhu's sherry cask mastery.

3. Glengoyne 24yo White Oak - £53.60

A very special limited edition 24 year old as part of the White Oak range. 24 Year Old is matured in American First Fill Bourbon and Virgin Oak casks. The perfect whisky for the bourbon lover. Included in Robb Reports 'Best of The Best 2025' - "This is a whisky you will want to taste over and over again". They also ranked it the 2nd best whisky released in 2025.

4. Glengoyne 25yo - £75.00

Matured exclusively in hand-selected sherry casks for a quarter of a century, this unique malt is an important addition to the Glengoyne collection. This bright amber beauty has red fruits, leather and brown sugar on the nose and soft oak, cinnamon, stewed fruits and a Seville marmalade tang on the palate. The finish is very long with spicy liquorice.

5. Tamdhu 21yo - £42.90

Tamdhu Distillery produces its spirit using its own local spring water. While all Tamdhu matures exclusively in the finest Oloroso sherry casks, Tamdhu Batch Strength 006 goes further still. Each cask is meticulously hand-selected to create this one-of-a-kind release.

Moreover, a high proportion of these casks are first-fill: the very best of the very best.

This scarce wood bears two great gifts: colour and taste. The deep copper hue of Tamdhu Batch Strength 006 is developed by the cask, nothing more - and each drop owes its rich, complex taste to its Oloroso cask home. Finally, Batch Strength 006 is bottled un-chillfiltered at high strength. A magnificent Speyside Single Malt for the sherry wood connoisseur.
